In 2019, our focus remains on developing a new generation of leadership for the Historical Society. In particular, we need:

- 1) Individuals who can help us organize our Annual Holiday Social;
- 2) Volunteers to step forward to share in our rotation schedule to offer docent services for our 2-hour Sunday afternoon museum hours.

I've said it before, and I will say it again: our Society is one of the smoothest-running organizations I have had the pleasure to be involved with. ## Here are some highlights from 2018:

- A fantastic new program on Mendon Ponds Park presented
- New exhibits including Mendon Ponds (90 years), ice harvesting and advertising items given away by local businesses.
- While we missed the presentation on **Honeoye Falls Railroads** from David Monte Verde, that program has been rescheduled for September 5, 2019.
- The Society co-sponsored the Festival on the Green during Fathers' Day weekend and opened the Museum during all three "Movies in the Park" (thanks go to **Jaren Miner** for also staffing one of the movies), as well as during the annual Girl Scout Pumpkin Fest.
- Donations continue to arrive at the museum. Chief among these is an oil painting of early Mendon settler **Abram Cole**.
- Ron Lord, Kevin Yost and Gary Albright each donated several items.

- We acquired a number of items related to the **Sibleyville Inn**.
- We added cobbler's lasts and stands from the estate of **Frank Oppedisano**.
- We hosted **schoolhouse and museum visits** by HF-L students as well as students from other school districts.
- Continued implementing the recommendations set forth in **Gary Albright's** 2016 conservation assessment by:
  - Reviewing the results of our year-long installation of humidity and temperature monitors throughout the Museum;
  - Supported by that data, working with Brian Anderson and the Village of Honeoye Falls
    administration to determine if it is time to replace the furnace with a new HVAC system,
    pending final approval in 2019.
- Received a third \$500 grant from the **Maletta Foundation** to use toward improvements for our Museum and facilities.
- Replaced our cumbersome A-frame "Museum Open" sidewalk sign with an eye-catching and easier-to-manage flag.
- Approved the Society's 2019 Budget; there is no change to our membership dues for 2019.

## Goals for 2019:

- Work with the Village of Honeoye Falls to finalize the installation of a new HVAC in the museum.
- Pursue a restoration grant for our newly-acquired portrait of Abram Cole.
- Continue to collect recommendations to expand our Historical Society website. Please contact me to offer your thoughts and insights.
- Continue indexing our archival materials and donations of artifacts to the Museum.
- As stated in my introduction, we have a wonderful set of programs planned for 2019, as detailed in the accompanying program guide. Please mark these on your calendars. I hope that you, like I, consider these part of your evening nourishment on the first Thursday of each month.

As noted above, the **financial budget for 2019** was approved at the quarterly Trustees Meeting on December 5. Membership dues are being kept at the same amounts that were set in **2002**. The dues support our program expenses and enable keeping our Museum open to the public.
